The event will begin at 1 p.m. in the Cordts Arena of Frostburg State University. The ID and safety program will be offered during the games.

The Freemasons' Maryland Safety Education and Identification Program is a comprehensive identification and protection program

designed to give families a measure of protection against the problem of missing children.

Mdchip is endorsed by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children.

Parents will be provided with a CD with child's name, address, height, weight, eye color, hair color, description of distinguishing marks, notes on health concerns, birth date, parental/guardian contact information, 3 to 4 photos, a video interview of the child, Digital fingerprints, DNA sample and a dental waxer.
