

Todd, D'Atri lead Western Maryland boys to victory

West Virginia wins girls game for split in 35th All-Star Basketball Classic

FROSTBURG — Clay Todd scored 22 points and led a blistering shooting performance that carried Western Maryland to a 123-81 victory over West Virginia in the boys game of the 35th annual

West Virginia won the girls game, 55-27.

In the boys game, Western Maryland hit 45 of 65 shots — 69 percent — from the field. The Marylanders made 29 of 38 two-pointers (76 percent) and 16 of 27 three-point shots (59 percent).

Todd, of Southern Garrett made 8 of 9 field goals, was 4 for 4 on three-point shots and 2 for 2 from the free-throw line for a game-high 22 points.

Mario D'Atri, of Allegany, was 3 of 5 on three-point shots and had 15 points, Brian Reams, of Southern Garrett, was also 3 of 5 from the three-point line and had 13 points.

Northern Garrett's Trevon Jones added 13 points, Fort Hill's Kris Jackson 12, and Darquel Jessie 11. Steven Glasbrenner, 2 of 3 from the three-point line, added nine points, and Dajaun Pendergast of Allegany and Kevin Gamble of Mountain Ridge had eight.

Western Maryland led 58-34 at halftime.

While the Marylanders had a big shooting day, the West Virginians struggled, finishing

at 39 percent (29 for 73).

Hampshire's Travis Clower, 8 for 14 from the field, led West Virginia with 21 points. Frankfort's Chase Detrick had 14, Tucker County's Derek Zirk 13 and Keyser's Ryan Streets 11.

Todd and D'Atri were named the Western Maryland team's most valuable players, and Clower and Detrick were selected the MVPs of the West Virginia team.

In the girls game, West Virginia dominated the second half and cruised to victory with all 10 players reaching the scoring column.

Keyser's Lexi Taylor led the balanced attack with 10 points.

Paw Paw's Belle Harrold had nine and Pendleton County's Michaela Raines, Moorefield's Alisha Redmon and Paw Paw's Alivia Snyder six apiece.

Fort Hill's Camden Wilson and Southern Garrett's Kambrrie Bosley had nine points for Western Maryland.

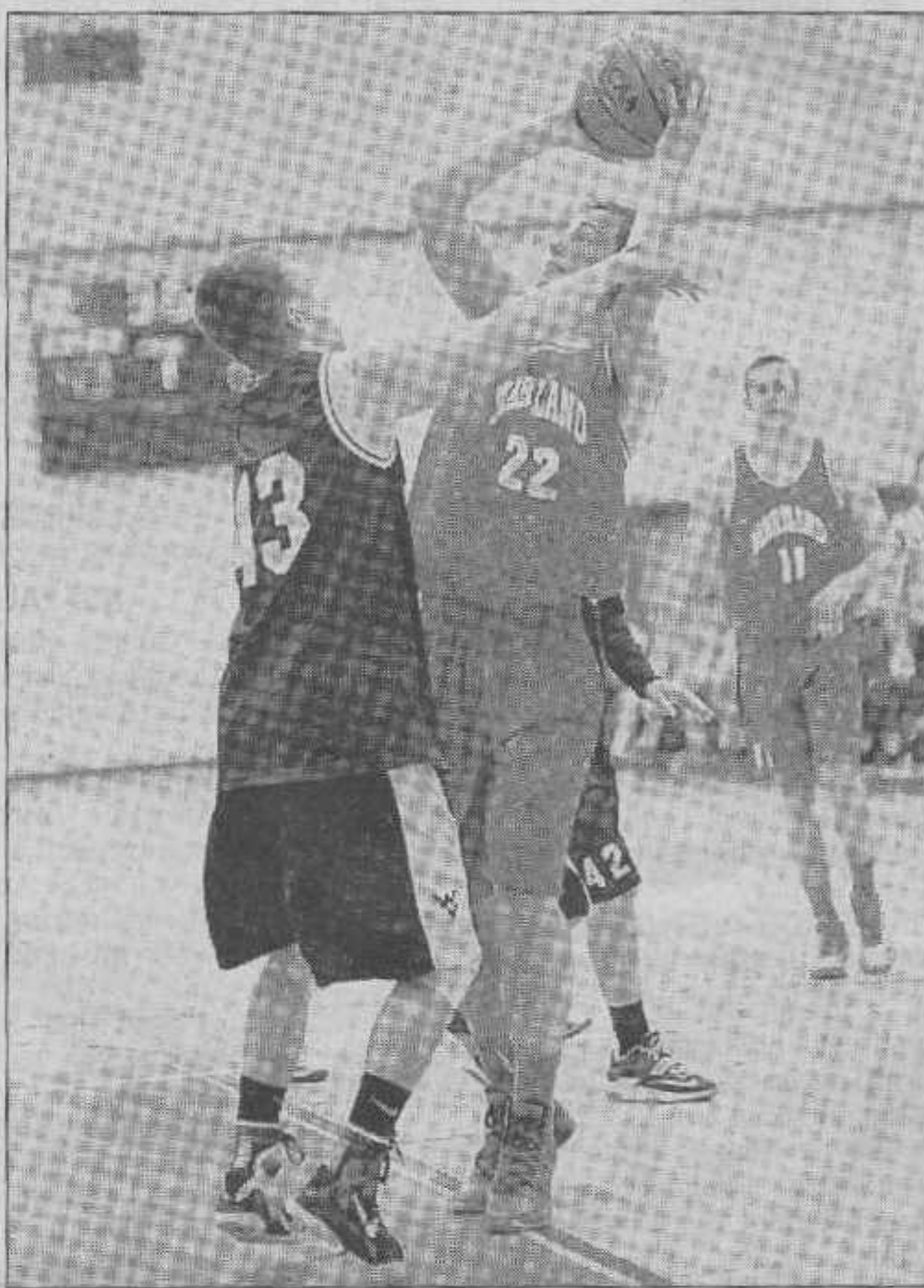
West Virginia led 24-22 at halftime, then outscored Western Maryland 31-5 in the second.

Taylor and Snyder had six points and Keller five during West Virginia's second-half surge.

West Virginia shot 15 of 30 in the second half and finished 25 for 45 (55 percent).

Western Maryland was 1 of 12 from the field in the second half and 10 of 38 for the game.

Taylor and Harrold were named the West Virginia team's MVPs, while Wilson and Bosley were chosen the Western Maryland MVPs.
