FROSTBURG — The public is invited to help Frostburg take one step closer to finalizing an application for a state-designated arts and entertainment district during a community forum at 6:30 p.m. Monday at City Place, 14 S. Water St.

During the meeting, FrostburgFirst, a community-driven program established to foster economic development and cultural growth in Frostburg, and the Arts and Entertainment Committee will present a map that illustrates suggested areas for inclusion in
